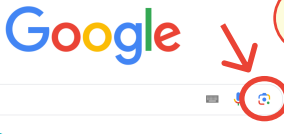


Using Google Lens

Google Lens

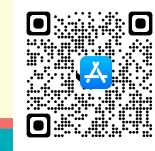
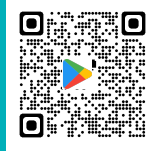
With Google Lens, you can search for what you see. Lens uses a photo, your camera, or just about any image to help you find visually similar images and related content by collecting results from all over the web.

Open Google Lens by clicking this icon

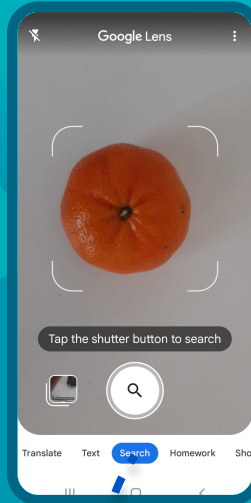

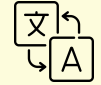

1 You can capture what you see with your camera or explore images you've recorded.



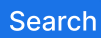
2 Translate: Point the camera image at the text you want to translate, then choose which language you want the text translated into. After that, you will see the translated text on the screen



3 Text: Take a picture of the text you want and Lens will tell you the source, so you can listen to the text if you need it



4 Search: Take a photo of an object, piece of furniture, or a garment, and Lens shows you the matches it finds, along with pricing information



5 Homework: Take a picture of your assignment and Lens will find matching web pages. Here you can also translate the text and listen to what you copied

6 Shopping: Take a picture of a product or barcode, Lens will find matches on the website.



7 Places: Point your camera to learn more about buildings and attractions.



Google Lens currently supports: English, Spanish, French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Korean, Chinese, Danish, Dutch, Hindi, Indonesian, Japanese, Polish, Russian, Swedish, Thai, Turkish, and Vietnamese.
